The Land Use Plan Map Amendment is requested in order to increase potential density from 40 temporary lodging units per acre to 50 temporary lodging units per acre for the existing Hotel use. Subject to any matters that may be discussed at this hearing, staff has not identified any inconsistencies with the Comprehensive Plan. **PUBLIC HEARING, SECOND AND FINAL READING  
(QUASI-JUDICIAL)**

NOTE: The applicant is requesting a rezoning from “M-1” Light Industrial District to “B-1” General Commercial District or a zoning classification of a lesser intensity as identified by Chapter 18, Land Development Code, of the City of Pinellas Park for a 3.00 acre parcel of land generally located at 12600 Roosevelt Boulevard. The rezoning is requested in order to increase potential density from 40 temporary lodging units per acre to 50 temporary lodging units per acre for the existing Hotel use. Subject to any matters that may be discussed at this hearing, staff has not identified any inconsistencies with the Comprehensive Plan. The proposal should have no adverse effect on adopted levels of service for City infrastructure. At their meeting of March 6, 2008, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended APPROVAL of the rezoning based on the “Responses of Relevant Considerations for Rezoning.” The Relevant Considerations found that:

1. The rezoning is consistent with the City’s Comprehensive Plan Policies.
  2. The rezoning would not adversely affect the neighborhood.

**PUBLIC HEARING (QUASI-JUDICIAL)**

NOTE: The applicant is requesting to allow a “Communication Tower” on the same site as an approved Conditional Use for an “Automotive Dealer-used cars”, “Automotive Repair Facility (major)” and “Outdoor Sales of Boats, RV’s and Mobile Homes” in the “CH” Heavy Commercial District with a waiver to the Conditional Use requirement that limits the height of the communication tower for one user, on a 5.972 acre parcel of land generally located at 7725 78<sup>th</sup> Street. The applicant is proposing the construction of a monopole tower with a flush mount antenna. In order to meet the engineering requirements of its network, T-Mobile requires that its antennas be located at 160 feet. Therefore a waiver to the Conditional Use requirement that communication towers that are to be designed and used for single users shall not exceed 120 feet in height with an additional 20 feet per user, not to exceed 160 feet. Surrounding land uses are: to the north and west, Wagon Wheel Flea Market; to the south, J. D. Byrider Auto Sales; to the east, a single-family dwelling and an Assisted Living Facility. Subject to any matters that may be discussed at the hearing, staff has not identified any inconsistencies with the Comprehensive Plan. The proposal should have no adverse effect on adopted levels of service for City infrastructure. At its meeting on April 3, 2008, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the above request.

ACTION: (Approve – Deny) A request to allow a “Communication Tower” in the “CH” Heavy Commercial District with a waiver to the Conditional Use requirement that limits the height of the communication tower for one user on a parcel of land generally located at 7725 78<sup>th</sup> Street, based on the staff report and the criteria found in Section 18-1509.4(B) & (C).

**PUBLIC HEARING (QUASI-JUDICIAL)**

NOTE: The applicant is requesting an amendment to an approved Preliminary Site Plan for a parcel of land in the “M-1” Light Industrial Zoning District that functionally abuts a residential zoning district. The applicant proposes site improvements for the expansion of an outdoor storage area of an industrial use (wholesale distributor of roofing material) on a 1.96 acre MOL parcel of land generally located at 6520 35<sup>th</sup> Street. The applicant is proposing a ten-foot-wide landscape buffer and a six-foot-high solid wall along the north property line to screen and buffer the industrial activity. Ingress/egress onto 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be eliminated. The applicant purchased additional land to expand the facility. The surrounding area consists of: to the north, mobile home dwellings, commercial and industrial uses; and to the south, Pinellas Park Water Management District; to the east, Saturn of St. Petersburg; and to the west, Greater Bay Roofing and a large retention area. Subject to any matters that may be discussed at the hearing, staff has not identified any inconsistencies with the Comprehensive Plan. The proposal should have no adverse effect on adopted levels of service for City infrastructure.

ACTION: (Approve – Deny) An approved Preliminary Site Plan for a parcel of land in the “M-1” Light Industrial Zoning District that functionally abuts a residential zoning district for site improvements for the approved expansion of an outdoor storage area of an industrial use (wholesale distributor of roofing material) generally located at 6520 35<sup>th</sup> Street, subject to the following conditions:

1. A Unity of Title shall be recorded and submitted to the Zoning Division prior to Final Site Plan approval.
2. There shall be no ingress/egress drive from the 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue right-of-way to the parcel.
3. Shielding of outdoor storage areas shall only be by solid wall.
4. Landscaping for the development of the parcel shall meet Code requirements.

NOTE: The solid waste and residential contract with Waste Management, Inc. of Florida allows for the contractor to petition for adjustments on the basis of extraordinary changes in its costs of doing business resulting from circumstances beyond its control. Waste Management, Inc. of Florida has experienced substantial increases for the purchase of diesel fuel since the contract began in 2003 and has requested a ten percent (10%) fuel surcharge be added to all utility accounts billed for refuse collection and residential recycling service.

- C1 AUTHORIZATION TO FUND ADVANCED POLICE TRAINING FROM CONFISCATED PROPERTY FUND.**

NOTE: Police leadership programs are essential for police supervisors to develop and enhance their leadership skills while focusing on the latest, most relevant issues facing our community. Quality police leadership programs draw on the best contemporary business curricula and tailor the learning to the needs of public safety leaders. Our employees will focus on developing and enhancing their abilities to deal successfully with the many complexities facing the field of law enforcement. These programs go beyond the curriculum offered by traditional management programs. A great deal of emphasis is placed on teamwork, integrity, communication, crisis management, technology, and managing change. There are high expectations for interagency cooperation, problem solving, case analysis, critical thinking, and academic excellence. These programs cultivate personal and professional growth, focus on styles of leadership, and help leaders succeed in a dynamic, ever-changing culture.

Chief Thomas is requesting funding through our Confiscated Property Fund.

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- C1** If approved, Sergeant Mark Berger will attend in residency the 120<sup>th</sup> Administrative Officers Course at the University of Louisville's Southern Police Institute August 11 through November 7, 2008. The cost for this training that is inclusive of tuition, books, housing, travel, and per diem is \$9,600.

In November 2008, Orange County Sheriff's Office will host the SWAT Round-Up International Competition. This event combines education and training seminars, and head-to-head competition into one major event. Twenty-six years ago, SWAT Round-Up International began as a means to provide a forum for the exchange of ideas among agencies. SWAT Round-up has now evolved into an international showcase for tactical teams from across the United States and Europe. Great efforts are made to ensure the primary focus of SWAT Round-Up International remains committed to team and individual training.

The Training and Education Program is an extremely vital part of the SWAT Round-Up International experience. In the past, training topics generally include addressing homeland security, crowd management, and law enforcement response to terrorism. Numerous other applicable courses for tactical teams are also available. Nationally renowned instructors participate in the training and education offered during this six day symposium. No other venue offers an equal gathering of distinguished experts. This training experience brings experts together from all over the country to train our team members. This unique opportunity provides lessons learned from actual case studies or prior incidents, recognizes new and innovative tactics other teams have employed, encourages contact with other agencies as a year round resource, and motivates our team members to maintain peak physical fitness/condition. The competition aspect of Round-up evaluates performance under stress and promotes team innovation and problem solving. If approved, eight of our SWAT Team Members will attend the SWAT Round-up International Competition. The cost for this training that is inclusive of entry fee, ammunition, hotel accommodations, and per diem is \$4,600.

Pursuant to Florida Statute 932.704(3)(a), this is to certify that this proposed expenditure complies with the State – required provisions for expenditure of these funds.

**ACTION:** (APPROVE-DENY) Authorization to fund advanced police training for police employees from the Confiscated Property Fund Balance to Confiscated Property Fund Operating Account 104-212-5-536-02 in the amount of \$14,200.

**C2 AWARD OF BID 08/001 — 2007/2008 ANNUAL PAVING / RESURFACING PROJECT AND CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 — Tampa Pavement Constructors, Inc.**

NOTE: Bids were legally advertised, and bid invitations were mailed to 354 prospective bidders. Six (6) bids were received with Tampa Pavement Constructors, Inc. (918 East Busch Blvd., Tampa, FL 33612) being the low bidder with a bid submittal of \$325,444.07. The amount budgeted for this project is \$500,000 (pg. 400 of the FY 07/08 adopted budget). Change Order No. 1 is recommended for approval so that the City may take advantage of favorable contract prices and budgeted funds. This Change Order of \$158,805.61 represents an increase in the lowest bid amount of 48.8%, bringing the total adjusted contract amount to \$484,249.68. This project will be charged to account 301-481-5-714-06.

ACTION: (Approve-Deny) Authorization to award Bid 08/001 and approve Change Order No. 1 for the 2007/2008 Annual Paving / Resurfacing Project to Tampa Pavement Constructors, Inc., Tampa, FL 33612, in the amount of \$484,249.68 to be charged to the appropriate account.

In order to carry out its function, Pinellas Core Management Services provides representatives at various locations within Pinellas County.

The City wishes to host one or more Pinellas Core Management Services representatives whose mission will be to conduct the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters program to the benefit of residents of the City of Pinellas Park.

The parties have reached an agreement with respect to the City hosting such representatives, and now wish to reduce their agreement in this regard to writing.
